PARIS PHOTO LAUNCHES PARIS PHOTO WEEK-END 12.15 NOV 2020

Paris, 15 October 2020 - Following the announcement of the postponement of its 2020 edition, Paris Photo presents Paris Photo Week-End, an event dedicated to photography and the Parisian arts scene from 12 to 15 November 2020.

In association with partnering galleries and institutions, Paris Photo Week-End is an opportunity for art lovers and collectors to discover over 70 gallery shows, museum exhibitions and cultural initiatives across the city in an event in promotion of photography and the photographic ecosystem.

Over the course of four days, visitors will have the occasion to explore a panorama of the photographic medium from its origins to its most contemporary forms. Discussions, meetings with artists, book signings and awards ceremonies will also be organized, all the while complying to strict public health protocol. A list of all events taking place over Paris Photo Weekend will be available online in the Paris Photo *Agenda*, with some events being broadcast live on social media.

In some forty Parisian galleries, discover a wide panorama of photography ranging from a selection of historic works at Françoise Paviot, portraits from the 20s and 30s at Gilles Peyroulet or photographs by Kati Horna at Sophie Scheidecker to a contemporary selection such as Paulien Oltheten at the Galerie des Filles du Calvaire or Elsa and Johanna, discovered in 2019 at Paris Photo, with the gallery La Forest Divonne.

Great names in photography will be in the spotlight with Joseph Koudelka and Harry Gruyaert at Magnum, Bernad Plossu and Sarah Moon at Camera Obscura, Martine Barrat at La Galerie Rouge and an Italian series by Herbert List at Karsten Greve. Nathalie Obadia will propose in her two Parisian spaces shows by Agnès Varda and Luc Delahaye. And for the first time this year, we will have the pleasure to welcome the gallery Vallois which will propose a group show of the Spanish artist Pilar Albarracín and the French Julien Berthier and Alain Bublex.

Projects around strong themes will also be proposed in the city such as the aesthetic gaze of an anonymous artist with a fetish for stockings at the Christian Berst Art Brut gallery, the voguing scene at Dominique Fiat or the Moroccan scene in an ephemeral place at gallery 127. The complete programme will be announced at a later date.

At the initiative of the Ministry of Culture, a gallery path of works by women photographers, *Elles x Paris Photo*, will be presented based on a selection by Karolina Ziebinska-Lewandowska, curator at the Centre Pompidou's photography department and curator of the event. The project is a three-year-long initiative to increase the recognition and visibility of women photographers. A day of conversations on female artists, moderated by Fannie Escoulen, will also be proposed as well as a dedicated website, ellesxparisphoto.com. The project also benefits from the support of *Women In Motion*, a program by Kering that highlights the place of women in arts and culture.

At the same time, Paris Photo, Picto Foundation and SNCF Gares & Connexions have come together for the fourth consecutive year to promote young talent, with *Carte Blanche - Students*. The projects of the laureates Rosie Dale, Kinsco Bede, Mathieu Croizier, Victoire Inchauspé & Emma Passera, chosen from a range of candidates from more than 100 European schools, will be on view from 16 October to 15 December in an exhibition at Paris' Gare du Nord tailor-made for the train station in XXL format.

This year, the 35 finalists of the Paris Photo-Aperture Foundation PhotoBook Awards will be exhibited at DELPIRE & CO at 13 rue de l'Abbaye. The winners of the following three categories: First book, Book of the year, and Photographic Catalogue of the year will be revealed on 13 November. Two days of online conversations with artists and publishers, organised by DELPIRE & CO, will take place during the weekend.

In association with Paris Photo's Parisian partnering arts museums and organizations, you are invited to discover the photographic arts through a selection of leading exhibitions this autumn, including Cindy Sherman at the Fondation Louis Vuitton, *Black & White* at the Grand Palais, Man Ray and Fashion at the Musée du Luxembourg, Miguel Rio Branco at Le BAL, and Joseph Koudelka at the Bibliothèque Nationale de France, among many more to be found in the *In Paris during Paris Photo* program.

Paris Photo Weekend benefits from the support of public partners, including the Ministry of Culture and the Ville de Paris. We thank our public and private institutions for their participation in our VIP programme. This event could not take place without the considerable support of private partners such as Kering and DELPIRE & CO.
