

PARIS PHOTO 2022 ANNOUNCES 181 EXHIBITORS FOR THE 25th EDITION

GRAND PALAIS ÉPHÉMÈRE FROM 10 TO 13 NOVEMBRE 2022

Paris Photo, the leading international fair dedicated to the photographic medium, returns to the Grand Palais Éphémère in the heart of Paris from November 10 to $13^{\rm th}$, 2022. For 25 years, the fair has worked to develop and support photographic creation by promoting the work of gallery owners, publishers and artists.

The 25th edition of Paris Photo is organized around 3 sectors bringing together 181 exhibitors from 31 countries. In the **main sector**, 134 galleries, including 18 new participants, present a complete panorama of the history of the medium from its origins to today. The *Curiosa* sector, dedicated to emerging art, brings together 16 galleries from 9 countries under the direction of guest curator Holly Roussell. The **book sector** gathers 32 publishers from 9 countries, proposing unique and rare editions and avant-premiere releases complete with a program of signatures featuring the world's most renowned artists.

Among this year's new galleries, WILDE GALLERY (Geneva) proposes a solo show of Marina Abramović questioning the ephemerality of performance art. GALERIE C (Paris) shows for the first time two series of photographs by Lukas Hoffman.

NATURE MORTE (New Delhi), presents Bharat Sikka's work exploring questions of gender, sexuality and psychology. PERSIEHL & HEINE in Hamburg presents the latest works by Gregor Törzs, and his self-made underwater cameras.

SETAREH (Düsseldorf) offers artworks by Philipp Goldbach, Peter Miller and Sebastian Riemer. On a co-stand MARTCH ART PROJECT (Istanbul) & ZILBERMAN (Istanbul) are presenting the works of Zeynep Kayan and Alp Sime.

Also note the return of GOODMAN GALLERY (Johannesburg) with a selection of important works by David Goldblatt but also by Alfredo Jaar, winner of the 2020 Hasselblad Foundation International Award, as well as the Barcelona gallery JOAN PRATS with works by Cabello & Carceller, Hannah Collins and Collins and Carles Congost, and many others including GEORGES-BAUDOIN LEBON (Paris), DANZIGER (New York), ERIC DUPONT (Paris), FAHEY/KLEIN (Los Angeles), LELONG & CO (Paris), PETER FETTERMAN (Santa Monica), ROBERT KOCH (San Francisco), STEPHEN BULGER (Toronto),...

SOLO AND DUO SHOWS

Paris Photo presents 40 solo and duo shows and offers a unique opportunity to immerse oneself in the work of an artist, but also to discover the dialogue which can be created between two artists in the space of the gallery stand. 27 Solo Shows are proposed for this $25^{\rm th}$ edition. Among them, we find Daniel Gordon with a unique installation at HUXLEY PARLOUR (London), Barbara Probst with a triptych realized during the confinement and her work in 12 parts Exposure #106 at KUCKEI + KUCKEI (Berlin), Boris Mikhaïlov at SUZANNE TARASIEVE (Paris) with an homage to the Ukrainian people in a rarely shown series, Theater of War, and at DANZIGER (New York) vintage photographs by Francesca Woodman. In avant-premiere, NFT by Gregory Crewdson in a widescreen presentation at LOUISE ALEXANDER / FELLOWSHIP (Los Angeles). Among the 13 duo shows proposed, ANNE-SARAH BENICHOU gallery (Paris) unveils Corps Lucides, a work in progress by Léonard Bourgeois Baulieu, and a diptych by Laurent Montaron, LUME (São Paulo) presents works by Julio Bittencourt and Mame-Diarra Niang, and at TOBE (Budapest), find a selection of works by Anna Fabricius and Dafna Talmor.

GROUP SHOWS

Among the group shows announced, ADN (Barcelona) explores the iconography of disaster and protest, particularly in terms of femininity and mass media; KARSTEN GREVE (Paris) presents three masters of photography, Eugène Atget, Brassaï and Edward Steichen. MAGNUM (Paris) celebrates the 75th anniversary of the agency with an exhibition of Magnum artists curated by Martin Parr. FRAENKEL (San Francisco) brings together a selection of the gallery's renowned artists, with the introduction of Carrie Mae Weems and her images from her Louisiana Project.





THE CURIOSA SECTOR

The Curiosa sector, inaugurated in 2015 and dedicated to emerging artists, presents a selection of 16 projects curated by Holly Roussell. Roussell is curator at the UCCA Center for Contemporary Art, Beijing. Roussell's selection features solo presentations of 17 artists from 12 countries, some of whom are exhibiting in France for the first time, such as Elliot & Erick Jiménez (SPINELLO Miami), and Pao Houa Her (BOCKLEY Minneapolis). This year Curiosa highlights interdisciplinarity in image-based art practices as well as photographic explorations in and beyond traditional genres of the medium. The section presents three capsules: experimental and conceptual approaches to image construction, new (self) portraits focusing on personal history and intersecting identities, and current practices in landscape photography.

"We are living in a world of image and information excess. As a curator I see it as my role to edit that information, to filter it, but to be inclusive, finding artists who need support to share their vision, and artworks that are meaningful. I see the mission of Curiosa as providing a platform for artists emerging into the global market. This resonates deeply with my own longstanding curatorial motivation: to mainstream the work of artists with enduring, serious practices who may not yet have the visibility they merit. Nine of the sixteen galleries exhibiting this year are new to Paris Photo, and almost every artist presented is a new voice to be discovered at the dawn of the commercial careers."
